PARISH LETTER

During my first visit to New Zealand one of the things I wanted to do during my stay in the South Island was to walk the Bridle Path from the port of Lyttelton into Christchurch. I mentioned this to a man sitting next to me on the plane and his comment was "there are more interesting walks". I explained why I wanted to do this walk but he was unimpressed! When the first settlers arrived in Lyttelton in 1850 after a long sea journey they had to take this path over the Port Hills into Christchurch. Parents with young children had to walk carrying all their belongings to begin a new life. I wanted to walk it and try to imagine how they did this. It took them two days as they were laden down whereas the only thing I had to carry was my camera. It took me two hours. I kept stopping to look around and took photos but I learned something of how arduous it must have been for them.

The Christian year is a journey for us. During Lent many of us have made some effort by giving something up or perhaps taking something on. As we approach the week before Easter Holy Week) this is an opportunity for us to embark on a path with Jesus walking with him on his way to the cross. I always find it helpful to read in St Mark's Gospel of the events of the week. I start at chapter 11 and continuing to chapter 16 (but you can pass quickly over chapter 13 or even omit it).

We begin on Palm Sunday when he rode on a donkey into Jerusalem (Mark 11. 1-11).

On the Monday we read of the cleansing of the Temple (Mark 11. 12-19).

On the Tuesday we read of the teaching by Jesus (Mark 11.20 -44).

On the Wednesday we read of his time in Bethany and of his betrayal by Judas (Mark 14.1-11).

On the Thursday (Maundy Thursday) we read of the preparation for the Passover and the Last Supper, the scene in Gethsemane and the arrest of Jesus (Mark 14. 12-72).

On the Friday (Good Friday) we read of the trial before Pilate and the Crucifixion (Mark 15. 1-47).

On the Saturday nothing is recorded.

Then on the Sunday (Easter Day) we read of the Empty Tomb and the Resurrection (Mark 16).

I find I am moved by reading the passages slowly each day and trying to imagine the events as if I were there. To go back to the Bridle Path walk, I could only imagine how the settlers coped with the burden. Reading the account of Holy Week we can only imagine. In a hymn we sing, *We may not know, we cannot tell what pains He had to bear; but we believe it was for us He hung and suffered there.*

And of course we have the real joy of knowing that **He is risen** and lives today.

On another of my trips to New Zealand I was invited to celebrate Holy Communion on Easter Sunday and I was told (ordered?) to use throughout the service as many times as I wished an acclamation and I was happy to obey. The acclamation was **Alleluia**, **Christ is risen! The** congregation replied **He is risen indeed**, **Alleluia !**

And both they and I said it each time loudly and with conviction.

I trust that we in Grimsargh will join in saying this on Easter Day.

Churches Together in Longridge and District held this year's service at St. Wilfrid's church. The service was prepared by Taiwanese women and was led by representatives of all our local churches.

The theme was one of encouragement, inspired by the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, (Ephesians 1:15), and members of the congregation were invited to write a message of encouragement to someone they know on one of the beautiful postcards that were provided.

During the first hymn, a large jigsaw puzzle showing a map of Taiwan was completed, to demonstrate how each of us has a part to play in encouraging others and bringing people to faith in Jesus.

We heard about the experiences of a range of Taiwanese women and about how they had encouraged others through their words and actions. There were opportunities to join in prayer and reflection and to sing hymns, which were accompanied by the music group from St. Wilfrid's church and three pupils from St. Wilfrid's Primary School. Two classes from St. Wilfrid's joined us for the service and made a wonderful contribution by leading our singing of a new hymn, 'I have heard about your faith', which they had learned especially for this occasion.

Some excellent sandwiches and cakes, provided by members of St. Wilfrid's congregation, were served after the service, and many people stopped to enjoy them and to speak to friends. A retiring collection, in aid of World Day of Prayer's many charitable causes, raised £165.50. Thank you to everyone who supported or attended the service this year.

However, if you have moved into the village, started attending church or turned 16 in the last 12 months and would like to be included on the electoral roll please fill in a form that can be picked up from the back of church or downloaded from the church website.

Who can be on the electoral roll?

To be on the electoral roll a person needs to have been baptised, be at least 16 years old and either:

- Living in the parish and a member of the Church of England or a Church in communion with the Church of England.
- Not resident in the parish but is a member of the Church of England (or a Church with which the Church of England is in communion) and has regularly attended worship in the parish during the six months prior to enrolment
- A member in good standing of a Church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and they are prepared to declare themselves a member of the Church of England, having regularly attended worship during the six months prior to enrolment.

Dates in our parish relevant to the review of the electoral roll:-

Put up notice regarding the revision at least 14 days before the start of the revision	7 th April 2023 at the latest
Undertake the revision on a fixed date 15 to 28 days before the APCM	21 st April 2023
Display the revised roll with a list of those names removed at least 14 days before the APCM	30 th April 2023
Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)	14 th May 2023

It's All Greek to Me (cont)

The Greek contribution to science, ie cold hard facts, is somewhat limited. There were plenty of bogus theories around the nature of matter, for example that everything is comprised of water, air, fire or earth. There were many other, wrong analyses. However, I will highlight two contributions which strike me personally as exceptional. The first is the short and pithy observation of Heraclitus, "Panta rhe"; literally, everything flows, or everything is in a state of flux. You may not think that is a particularly remarkable statement, it may strike you as obvious. But there were plenty of thinkers who thought otherwise, that despite some change, everything was permanent and had always been what it was and is. Whereas everywhere you look, all is in constant if sometimes subtle change. The other truly remarkable theory was that of Democritus in the 5th century BC, that everything is made up of tiny indivisible "atoms", a Greek word, literally from the Greek, that which cannot be split. That of course is also scientifically wrong, as we in modern times now know, with potentially devastating consequences. But it does seem to me as astonishing that a man could work out the nature of all matter just by intellectual analysis and evolve a theory which accounts for the nature of everything, without access to any scientific experimentation whatsoever Mark

MOTHERS' UNION

At the March meeting we met Kieran Spencer and Rachel Ray from Night Safe.

They told us about the work being undertaken in Blackburn for Homeless young people age 16-24. At vital charity helping those who have left home, or made to leave for many reasons - from physical, sexual, emotional abuse to breakdowns in relationships within the home.

When a young person arrives, they are placed in the emergency night shelter for 9 days, during which the staff support them in all areas from basic home skills– washing, cooking, budgeting to getting a job and furthering their education. After 9 days they move to one of their houses (as seen on SOS DIY with Nick Knowles last year!) where they continue to receive the support but encouraged to become more independent and to move on finally to their own homes and jobs by the time they are 24. They have helped young people from the whole of the Ribble Valley, include Longridge & Chipping recently. Their work is changing young people's lives for the better and giving them vital life-skills. We wished them well with their work and gave them donations. Their vision Is that every young person that comes through Nightsafe's door will have a roof over their head, live in a safe environment, be treated with kindness, dignity and respect and achieve their potential.

Mother's Union Caravan






