PARISH LETTER

Disappointment turned to Joy

In 1998, a year after my quadruple by-pass, I was told by my doctor that if I continued in the then parish, I would not live to draw my pension! She said I should seek early retirement. To cut a long story short, I took her advice seriously and the bishop backed this. We then went to live in our house in Wensleydale. I wondered, perhaps even worried, what the future held for me. After six months of complete rest my health began to pick up. I began to do some locum ministry which I coped with and enjoyed. I also enrolled on a course in stained glass at Darlington Arts Centre. Then towards the end of that year I was asked by the bishop if I would be priest-in-charge of two small parishes in Swaledale. My doctor said I was fit enough to do this. I spent seven very happy years in this ministry where the number of sheep was many times greater than the number of people!

I continued on the stained-glass course and in my workshop worked to improve my skills. I made a window for our house and a window for the Bishop of Knaresborough's chapel. I also entered a stained-glass nativity set of nine figures in the Wensleydale Show and won a first prize. I made many more of these sets and sold them to raise funds for the Melanesian Brothers. We chose to move to Longridge to be nearer to our family when I retired in 2007. I continued to make the nativity sets and sell them. I have lost count of how many I have made but an estimate would be about 600 sets! They are now also in New Zealand, Philippines, South Africa, Spain, America.

I went to Spain to be assistant chaplain on the Costa del Sol in 2009 for four years. I could not take my tools with me but I soon found that the Chinese Bazaars sold cheap tools including glass cutters and soldering irons. The quality of the tools was not very good but good enough for my work. I bought glass from a stained-glass artist in Malaga and I soon became a regular customer. The artist offered me a large discount on glass and an even larger discount on all metals! He even offered to help me with my work when I explained what I intended to make. When he saw my finished work, he said I did not need any help! I continued to make the nativity sets and to make a window the chapel of a retreat centre at a remote place in Andalucia. The design was based on Revelation 21. I also made a window for behind the altar in the chaplaincy church of St Andrew in Los Boliches. The design was based on the words of Jesus in John 15 "I am the vine. You are the branches".



Since Spain I have made windows for houses in Longridge and Ribchester (and more nativity sets !!). Last year I made free-standing crosses for each of the ten Melanesian Bishops who came to the Lambeth Conference and the Archbishop of Melanesia asked if I could also make a pectoral cross for him. I had work fast as he was due to return to Solomon Islands the following week but I for him the cross before he departed.

Some years ago, I made large nativity sets for Fosbrooke House chapel in Lytham and Christ Church in Longridge and also Easter scenes for both places. I am thankful that, despite the gloom of (forced) early retirement, I have enjoyed good health and have known God's help in recovery. I am able now to cover in many parishes regularly where there are vacancies and to enjoy this ministry. Also, to learn and use stained glass skills to support the Melanesian Brothers in their ministry. They are a religious order. They are poor in life but rich in faith as I experienced on my two visits to work with them in Solomon

Islands. I would like to return there **but** I have to be content in supporting them and praying for them as they follow Jesus and make him known throughout the Islands. I value keeping in regular touch on line with Melanesian news and meetings.

A Ramble round Rome

Following the excitement of my Greek articles, I follow with articles giving a brief summary of Latin literature. To put the literature into context, let me give a resume of early Roman history. Back in the early hundreds BC Rome was just one of a number of city states on the Italian Peninsula, the main power being the Etruscans. But Rome defeated Etruria, and then dominated the Italian land. It sought to make colonies in the Mediterranean, in Spain in particular which brought it into conflict with the main sea power, Carthage. After Hannibal gave the Romans a nasty shock by invading Italy from the Alps and inflicting several defeats on her, including the massive defeat at Cannae, finally Rome conquered Carthage, and literally destroyed it. Reputedly, by the mid 2nd century BC a plough could run over the ground on which the former city lay, in modern Tunisia. There then followed for Rome a century of vicious

political infighting, and open civil war. It began after the fall of Carthage, with a shift in the social order of the Roman state. As in mediaeval England and elsewhere, wealth and with it, power began to move away from those who held land, to the merchant class.

The problem for the new men as they were known in Rome, was that all the levers of power remained with the old senatorial class who would not yield it up. This led to a challenge by the popularly elected "tribunes of the people", who initially were dominant through a successful general, Marius, around 100 BC. But that period was followed by a reaction when the old order reasserted itself through the dictatorship of Sulla, followed by vicious infighting by the new men, the first "Triumvirate" as it is known, an informal carve up by the 3 most successful men of the time, Pompey and Caesar, both generals, and a 3rd man of enormous wealth, Crassus, who also took up generalship. In the film Spartacus, the 2 armies which eventually suppressed the slave revolt, shown at the end of the film, were that of Pompey, returned to Rome after a successful campaign in the East, and that of Crassus.

The viciousness of the times is best indicated by this fact, that each of the 3 triumvirs died a violent death; Crassus after an unsuccessful foray in the East where he and most his army were slaughtered, Pompey after defeat by Caesar, and of course Caesar himself, famously assassinated in the Senate building.

This is the background to Latin literature, where at least 2 of the leading politicians of the time left a literary legacy, Caesar and Cicero, who incidentally was also murdered, at the instance of Mark Anthony, who himself committed suicide after military defeat by Augustus, the last man standing, who ushered in the empire, and a period of comparative peace wherein some of the Latin literature was composed.

SCHOOL REPORT

On Monday 5th June, Reverend Jeff took the lead during our whole school Pentecost service in church. The children sang beautifully and enjoyed sharing their ideas during Reverend Jeff's talk. A group of Year 6 pupils shared the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit from the book of Acts. Pentecost occurred 50 days after Easter Sunday, 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead. Jesus had already ascended to Heaven so the disciples and new believers of Jesus were waiting to receive the Holy Spirit because that's what Jesus told them would happen.

This week our Reception children have taken part in Lancashire County Councils' Stage 1 Right Start Child Pedestrian Training Programme. This Programme teaches children how to keep themselves safe when out and about in the traffic environment and to apply the rules of the Green Cross Code every time they cross a road.

They have been taught how important it is that they:

• Think- is this the safest place to cross the road?

• Stop- with their feet back from the kerb, which gives them time to Look and Listen.

• Look- for any vehicles that might be coming on the road – remember, children of this age are unable to judge speed and distance.

• Listen- for vehicles. They may hear something before they can see it – remind them though, that electric cars make very little noise.

• Think again- have they followed the rules, and will they keep Looking and Listening the whole time they are crossing the road?

They have also been reminded to play in a safe place away from traffic and to wear or carry something bright so they can be seen at the roadside by other road users. Please can you continue to reinforce these messages when out and about with your children.




