

PARISH LETTER

Up, up and away?

May this year sees us celebrate two important festivals in the life of the Christian Church, both recounted in the Acts of the Apostles. First, on the 9th of May comes the lesser celebrated Ascension Day. It is probably less celebrated as it falls on a Thursday. Luke tells the story twice, once in his gospel and again at the beginning of Acts.

In his gospel he says 'While He [Jesus] was blessing them [the disciples], He withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven.' In Acts he says 'When He [Jesus] had said this, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight.' So what actually happened and why do we think of heaven as 'up'?

A church I once went to, dedicated to the Ascension, had as its main window the picture of a cloud with 2 feet dangling underneath it. Perhaps for many of us this is what we picture, although if heaven was 'up' then surely NASA or some other space organisation would have found out by now!

Perhaps it is easier to think of heaven as a different plane of existence, God's holy dwelling place, that is higher (better, exalted) than ours. It is to here that Christ Jesus, both God and man was transported.

Jesus was clear that the days after Easter and before His ascension were about teaching the disciples about himself and how the Old Testament pointed to him and his life and death. These days were to equip the disciples for what was to come without his physical presence.

He also warned them that if he didn't go then 'the Advocate will not come to you' (John 16:7). Jesus didn't leave here to disappear and have no concern for how his Church would continue or grow. He left here so that the Holy Spirit could be sent to fill all his disciples, then and now, to enable us to know his presence every day.

Which leads us on to Pentecost. As Jesus was 'lifted up' so he sends the Holy Spirit 'down' - as recounted in Acts chapter 2. A physical Jesus, while no doubt answering many questions for us, couldn't inspire the whole Church to live for and witness to him. We need the Holy Spirit to be present in our lives every day to enable us to live as his disciples.

So this month come and join us as we remember Jesus' 'ascension' to heaven on the 9th of May so that we can be ready to encounter him in the Holy Spirit on the 19th of May. Let us celebrate Jesus our risen, ascended and glorified Lord and He enables us to live new lives for Him each and every day infused by the Holy Spirit.

Thursday Holy Communion

There is a celebration of Holy Communion based on the Book of Common Prayer at 11am on the third Thursday of the month. <u>This month the service will be on the fourth Thursday, 23rd May</u>. Everyone welcome.

Pentecost - not a Ghost but a Gift (Sunday 19th May)

We used to call it Whitsun – 'White Sunday' because long ago children marched to church in white on that day. There are no processions nowadays, and we've even changed its name. It's now 'Pentecost', which is more accurate but needs explaining.

Pentecost marks a vital event in Christian history. It is celebrated 50 days after Easter. The year Jesus was crucified (which took place at the Passover), the remnant of His followers, just 120 of them, were together in an upper room in Jerusalem. They were afraid to show their faces in case the authorities arrested them. But on the day of Passover, they had an amazing collective experience.

They described it in terms of wind and fire, a great surge of spiritual energy and confidence. Afraid no longer, they burst out on to the streets where crowds were gathering for the festival, led by Peter they began to tell them about Jesus and His resurrection. As they did so, although many of the people in the crowd were foreigners who spoke other languages, everyone heard them in their own tongue. Peter told them that what they were seeing was the fulfilment of an old prophecy when God would pour out His Spirit on the human race, men and women, young and old.

As a result of His words and the extraordinary spectacle, 3,000 people believed and were baptised in the name of Jesus. They were the nucleus of what in 100 years would be a Church that would turn history upside down. For Christians Pentecost is in effect the birthday of the Church.

Many people find the whole idea of the Holy Spirit mysterious and elusive. It wasn't helped by the earlier title 'Holy Ghost'. The spirit is not spiritually a 'ghost' but a precious gift.

A Ramble round Rome (continued)

Another author of early empire was Seneca. He was a senator and prominent in public life in the reigns of Caligula, Claudius and Nero, a somewhat unfortunate time to be around, when 2 of those 3 emperors were homicidal psychopaths. He narrowly evaded execution by Caligula, was exiled to Corsica by the usually more forgiving Claudius, and having been tutor to Nero, committed suicide on Nero's order having in effect been framed by him. So he needed all of his Stoic philosophy to steer him through a life of political turbulence.

He wrote plays, but he is most noted by posterity for his letters to friends in which he comments on mundane affairs in his life and expands on his philosophy. The outstanding example of this is his letter about old age. He amusingly compared his own ailing body to a rickety old cottage he owned in Italy, and from there went on to articulate his Stoicism, by accepting life as it comes. "Crastinum si adiecerit deus, laeti recipiamus." If God gives us an extra day, let's accept it gladly. He went on, that you are blessed if you can take that for just that, whatever it is and say, I have lived, "vixi".

damp biscuits. I can already hear in my mind the final hymn being drowned by kettles being filled, biscuit tins opened, cups thunderingly placed on saucers, while the volunteers discuss the dress sense of others in the congregation in deafening whispers.

I was a little surprised to hear that Colonel Wainwright was all in favour – until I realised that it would give him a place to totter into to read his newspaper once he got bored with my sermon, which usually seems to happen in the first minute. Naturally, smaller turf wars have broken out alongside the major battle. There is conflict about whether we should get new crockery, what colour carpeting tiles would look right – and most importantly of all, who will take charge of the coffee rota.

Others are totally against the project: the treasurer dreads the thought of signing yet more cheques, the churchwardens worry about removing pews which have quietly hidden the dry rot, and the theologically angst-ridden agonise about the fact that St Paul never mentioned coffee after Sabbath worship.

I am sure that by the time all these groups have come up with their conclusions, we will have safely moved on to fight the next Issue.

April Birthday Girls






