#### Break-ins.

Derby City Council has informed us of that between 12 midnight and 6.30am on Sunday 23rd March one of our Allotment groups suffered a break in to their site shop, store and 12 sheds.

The offenders gained access to the property via a hole that they made in the perimeter hedge.

Please note and encourage plot-holders to keep valuable items off site rather than store in sheds etc.

In addition would all plot holders check that there plot boundary is sound: if not please inform a member of the Committee (list on last page of this edition and on the central Notice Board).

### Annual General Meeting (main committee).

The Association's AGM was held on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2014. The meeting business was completed in very quick time. The main business was confirming the appointment of a new committee. For your information each year the committee and officers are all dismissed and new people appointed to the committee. Next year the newly appointed committee will be dismissed and a new one appointed. It is important that all plot holders attend (as long as the rent has been paid) to ensure that all views are collected and considered.
