Run Down of 2023

We finished the year on 6382 visitors, c. 1000 increase on 2022. We staged the following:

Make A Wish - celebrating the UK charity, first established in Camberley in 1986. This display has now been moved to Camberley Library for 2024. We worked closely with founding members to create content and events - an emotional & proud reunion for many.

Climate Change - a thought provoking exhibition in partnership with our Climate Change Officer and Surrey Museums Partnership. The museums was one of 7 in Surrey taking part in HLF funded Wild Escape project with workshops and events promoting collections and the natural world.

Nepali Connections - an updated version of a 2013 exhibition with local Nepali objects and craft works. The exhibition text was available in English and Nepali.

Paulo Gherri - return of our local art collector, Luciano Cassaro.

Music Makers - celebrating the musical associations of Surrey Heath.

We also welcomed a special display in partnership with The Sandhurst Collection which continues in 2024.

Our Projects

George Kenner paintings from his time as a POW in Frimley, 1915 were on loan to Knockaloe on the Isle of Man. Whilst on holiday, Gill Riding went over to the island to talk on George Kenner to their supporters.

Free French Blue Plaques - we

organized a community engagement project on the Old Dean Estate working with local schools and the community to place two blue plagues on buildings within the WWII Free French Forces Camp. The unveiling on 11th Nov attracted over 250 people from French Embassy, French War Graves Commission, French Cadets, Councillors, RMA Sandhurst and the local community. It was a privilege to have been involved in this emotional act of remembrance.

Education & Outreach Service

Our Education & Outreach Officer, Kathy Joice worked with over 1000 school children and 200 care home residents. It is a slow return to pre- pandemic bookings with more organisations booking digital workshops and loan boxes (packed full of interesting and handleable objects). In 2024 we are offering special National Curriculum workshops which tie in with national events on a local level (Black History Month, Local Democracy, Pride Month and British Science Week).

Our Volunteers and Work Experience

We are fortunate to have c.40 volunteers helping with care and improving access to our collections and welcoming visitors. Their support and loyalty enables the museum to develop and improve.

- 1. Alf Tarry was a local historian and his archive was kindly left to the museum by his family. The archive has been listed and available on our website.
- 2. We have a group of volunteers who have patiently worked through the collection for over 10 years - auditing, collecting information and improving collection care and access.
- 3. They help with exhibition work, events and outreach programmes.
- 4. They create a welcoming face to our visitors and assist with researchers and visitor enquiries.
- 5. We created our annual Museum Calendar this year matching 1916-1920 Camberley News adverts with contemporary photographs.
- 6. We had 5 work experience people from local schools and colleges. Although most are only with us for a short period (usually a week), they help with all aspects of museum work; engaging young people in their local heritage is an important part of our work. We welcomed Duke of Edinburgh participants for longer term periods and people on DWP employment schemes.
