Byelaw made by the Parish Council of Thorington under Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906 with regard to the Playing Field at Chapel Lane, Thorington

INTERPRETATION

- 1. In the byelaw:
 "the Council" means Parish Council of Thorington
 - "the ground" means the Playing Field at Chapel Lane, Thorington

 DOGS IN THE GROUND
 - 2. (1) No person in charge of a dog, other than a registered blind person in charge of a guide dog shall, without reasonable excuse, permit the dog to enter or remain in the ground.
 - (2) Notice of the effect of this byelaw shall be given by signs displayed in conspicuous positions at the entrance to the ground.
 - (3) An officer of the Council or any Constable may require a person in charge of a dog which has entered the ground to remove the dog from the ground.
 - 3. (1) For the purpose of byelaw 2 above, the keeper of the dog shall be deemed in charge thereof, unless the court is satisfied that at the time when the dog entered or remained on the ground it has been placed or taken into the charge of some other person.
 - (2) In paragraph (1) above the "keeper" shall include the owner of the dog or any person who habitually has it in his possession.
 - 4. Any person offending against these byelaws may be removed from the ground by any officer of the Council or any Constable.

PENALTY

5. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level two on the standard scale.
